

# **Experience** the Preservation

Eureka! You've found it - California's North Coast regional shopping and business center. Much of Old Town and Downtown still have the quaint architecture and flavor of the 1870's to early 1900's. Eureka offers some of the best-preserved early homes and commercial buildings in California, including French Second Empire, Greek Revival, Italianate, Eastlake, and Queen Anne. Enjoy your stroll through this National Register of Historic Places - A National Treasure.

## 1. The Boardwalk

This promenade dedicated in 2002 runs alongside Humboldt Bay, which is as salty as the Pacific ocean. James Talbot Ryan and party set up camp on this spot in the Spring of 1850 when the first survey of the townsite was conducted. For decades, up to 1971, a busy ferry service took workers from the foot of F Street to the sawmills on the other side of the Bay.

## 2. Buhne General Store c1858 ★

The sole surviving building of the Gold Rush Business District. Greek Revival.

## 3. E Janssen Building 1875 ★

Italianate style; perhaps the first fireproof building in Eureka, note remaining iron shutters on 2nd floor.

## 4. Wave Saloon 1893

Stick/Eastlake Victorian style. There were saloons on three of these four corners - part of a rough district starting in the 1890's. There was an LC Bordello upstairs.

## 5. P. Antonson Building 1891

las a wooden Italianate façade designed to look like cast iron. Originially a saloon, barber shop, and four-tub bathhouse.

## 6. D.C. McDonald Building 1904

Classical Revival in cast concrete blocks and brick. A major building supply sales outlet operated here into the early 1960s.

## 7. IOOF Lodge Hall 1882 ★

French Second Empire. The fluted columns are hollow cast iron. Upstairs was the meeting room of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows used into the early 1950s. Lowenthal's Dry Goods was a major business downstairs.

## 8. C.W. Long Building 1892

Eastlake-style. Side entries and bay windows added during 1983 renovation. This is the second location of a noted national chain, Restoration Hardware.

## 9. Louvre Café/High Lead Saloon c1873 ★

Note the free-standing locally cast columns on this early fireproof structure. Over the years it has been a haberdashery, French restaurant, and rough loggers' saloon.

# 10. Pacific Pharmacy (Palmtag Building) 1893 ★

Fine application of Queen Anne style with a plate glass storefront of 1922. The pharmacy operated from 1893 into the 1980s. After this, the very first Restoration Hardware opened.

## 11. Oberon Saloon 1886

Though remodeled, this Classical Revival building still has

sweeping arches and Corinthian capitals. Best remembered here was the saloon, a stylish place catering to guests at the Vance Hotel. Jack London fought here.

# 12. Vance Hotel 1872 and 1901 ★

First two floors French Second Empire/Italianate; top two floors Classical Revival. Built for lumber pioneer John Vance and a first class hotel into the 1950s.

## 13. Buhne Building 1884 ★

Renaissance Revival and the finest example of cast iron architecture on the North Coast. Built for pioneer navigator/ merchant Capt. H.H. Buhne. First floor at corner of 2nd was a bank; second floor a hotel; third floor was a hall for hire.

## 14. Joseph Russ Building/Belcher Abstract & Title Co. c1897

Outstanding commercial application of Queen Anne. First floor Belcher's 1897-1962; 2nd floor The Humboldt Club, a mens' club.

## 15. Carson Block 1892

Sullivanesque style, partially remodeled. Built for redwood lumber pioneer, William Carson; this was the first real office building on the North coast.

## 16. Ricks Building 1877

Opera alley is named for the Ingomar Theater. BON BONIERE was originally a candy store bearing the French words for a very pretty candy container & one of the oldest businesses still operating in the District. Note iron storefronts.

## 17. Rear Wall of Louvre Café

(Opera Alley). Note the c1915 sign; the second floor has always been an apartment, originally for the proprietor of the haberdashery.

## 18. 422 Second Street c1880 ★

Italianate Architecture. Built for J. McLauchlan Restaurant, saloons downstairs; Alpine Rooms upstairs. One of longest operating bordellos.

## 19. Bank Of Eureka 1912

Classical Revival in glazed terra cotta over rough brick walls. A leading bank into the late 1950s and the property of the Clarke Historical Museum since 1960, housing a very important collection of local Native American Basketry and Regalia.

## 20. Alonzo Monroe Building 1876

Italianate, original tenants: (left) Humboldt County Bank, (right) wholesale liquor.

## 21. Eureka Business College 1892 ★

(remodeled 1910). Some Italianate lines but once much more ornate. The only business college in the area was upstairs until 1942, then the space became a pool hall.

## 22. California Fruit Store

1894 Eastlake. All decorative elements are old growth redwood like other wooden buildings. The fruit store is now a market around the corner on D Street.

## 23. Metropole Hotel 1903 ★

Classical Revival. Furnished rooms/studio apartments have

comprised the upper floors historically and to this day.

## 24. Eagle House 🖈

The prominent building with the Queen Anne bay is the 1887 - 1893 Eagle House Hotel, later the Buon Gusto that served those traveling by steamship. It still operates as a hotel.

## 25. Jimmy Dunn's c1885

Residing and other renovation has erased original architectural detail. Until the mid-1990s, this operated as the last of the oldtime loggers, sailors, and fishermen's watering holes.

## 26. Romano Gabriel "Wooden Garden"

Late 1940s-c1967. A work of folk art by an Italian/Swiss woodworker for the front yard of his Pine Street home.

## 27. Dreamland c1908

Classical Revival (cornice missing). A variety of businesses operated here: harness and tinsmith's shop, theater, skating rink, Dreamland (a dime-a-dance-joint) and the last location of famed Lazio's Restaurant

## 28. C.W. Long Building 1877 ★

Storefronts of cast iron brought by ship from San Francisco. Among numerous tenants, Pluke's Paint Store is best remembered for its longevity.

## 29. Needs/Williams Building 1904 🖈

Neo-Classical Architecture.

## 30. Eureka Carriage Factory/Haensell's Eureka Bakery & Confectionary/Haensell's Restaurant 1871/1876

Streamline Moderne Architecture.

2nd Street, H to G: This is a splendid row of 1870s and 1880s buildings. 622 - 625 2<sup>nd</sup> expressly built for the US Post Office; 630 2nd, 1875, was a rooming house/bordello/saloon. 2nd Street, F to E: Spectacular variety of commercial fronts including Mission style and Queen Anne.
